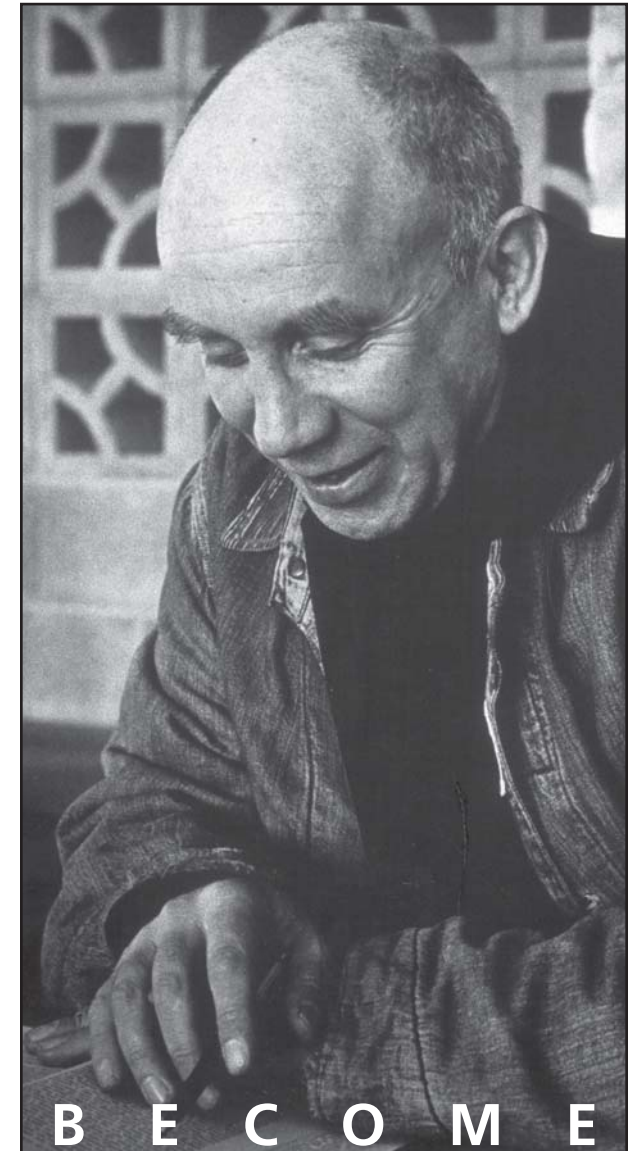

WHAT WE DO

The Thomas Merton Society of Canada (TMSC) seeks to make Thomas Merton's life and thought better known and to provide opportunities for reflection on some perennial issues of his time and ours. Steeped in Western and Eastern literature, Merton enhanced our knowledge of the self and showed the implications of this knowledge for our social thinking as well as our spiritual awareness.

In his lifetime, Thomas Merton was hailed as a prophet and censured for his outspoken social criticism. For twenty-seven years he was a monk of the austere Trappist order in Kentucky where he became an eloquent spiritual writer and contemplative as well as a poet, Zen calligrapher, photographer, and peace activist. Born in Prades, France, on January 31, 1915, Merton was educated at Cambridge University (England) and Columbia University (New York City). He died in Bangkok on December 10, 1968.

Our 2012/13 program includes public talks, retreats, pilgrimage programs, and seminars.

On July 4, 2006, the Thomas Merton Reading Room was formally opened at the Vancouver School of Theology in the H. R. MacMillan Library, which holds the monograph, serial, and media collections for the TMSC. The cooperative arrangement between the Vancouver School of Theology and the TMSC provides a specialized Merton collection, the most comprehensive in Canada.

HOW WE DO IT

The TMSC is a registered charitable organization that is run by a Board of Directors who meet monthly to manage the Society's diverse programs and projects. There are no paid employees.

We depend on your annual membership fees and financial gifts to pay for day-to-day operating costs such as printing, postage and website maintenance; for program costs, including facility rental, hospitality, and travel expenses of guest speakers and retreat leaders; and the acquisition of tapes and audiotapes for our lending library, as well as books for the Thomas Merton Reading Room in the H. R. MacMillan Library at the Vancouver School of Theology.
